WORLD CHILDREN'S DAY NOVEMBER 21st

A Better Future for Every Child

In the aftermath of World War II, the plight of Europe's children was grave, and a new agency created by the United Nations stepped in to provide food and clothing and health care to these children. In 1953, <u>UNICEF</u> (United Nations Chil



1953, <u>UNICEF</u> (United Nations Children's Fund) became a permanent part of the UN. Today, the agency works in more than 190 countries and territories, focusing special effort on reaching the most vulnerable and excluded children, to the benefit of all children, everywhere.

Food for thought:

The age of criminal responsibility is the age in which a child is considered by law to have understood that their actions were wrong and can face criminal charges. All Australian states and territories have this age set at only 10 years old. This means that across Australia, police have the power to arrest, strip-search and imprison children who are only 10. Many groups in Australia are working to change this law.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT, YR.C

ST ANDREW Feast Day 30th November (d. c.60)

St. Andrew was a native fisherman of Bethsaida in Galilee. Andrew was Saint Peter's brother,

and was called with him. "As [Jesus] was walking by the sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers. Simon who is now



called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them, 'Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men.' At once they left their nets and followed him" (Matthew 4:18-20). Andrew is said to have been martyred at Patras in southern Greece on an X-shaped cross. This type of cross has long been known as "St. Andrew's cross." *Catholic Culture & Franciscan Media*

SAINT FRANCIS XAVIER Feast Day 3rd December (1506-1552)



Francis Xavier was ordained a priest in Venice in 1537 after working with Ignatius of Loyola's Society of Jesus for 3 years After ordination Xavier travelled for 10 years

to Lisbon, the East Indies and Goa in India, always helping the ill and impoverished. He ministered in Malaysia and then Japan, where he died. His remains are enshrined in the Church of Good Jesus in Goa.

CANDLE FOR FIRST SUNDAY OF

ADVENT: HOPE

The first Advent candle, which is purple, symbolises **hope**. It is sometimes called the "Prophecy



Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who fore-told the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah *What are we hoping for this Christmas?*

COMPLIANCE WITH COVID-19 REGULATIONS

(Current from 23 November, 2021)

- Places of Worship are restricted to 3 people per 4 square metres with social distancing of 1.5 metres. If more than 50 people are present, there must be an independent COVID Marshal. QR codes and/or handwritten logs are essential.
- Only 5 people to sit in a pew and there is to be no kneeling.
- Wearing of masks is mandatory, except when going to Communion. (A doctor's certificate must be produced on request, if claiming an exemption.)
- Attendees at indoor religious services may sing during worship and members of choirs or chorus groups may perform or rehearse indoors, if they wear masks while doing so.
- Obligation for Sunday Mass for the laity HAS NOT BEEN RE-INVOKED at this stage. You may wish to access: Mass for You at Home The official website of Mass For You At Home, Australia online and on Channel 10 every Sunday at 6 am.

adventures and challenges lie ahead.


