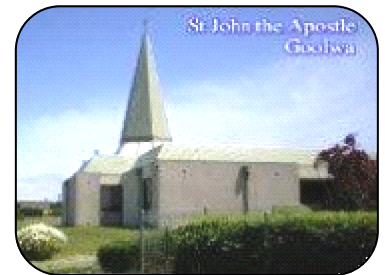

**GOSPEL**

**Luke 17:5-10**

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea," and it would obey you. "Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"?"

Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty.""

**THE MUSTARD SEED PROJECT**

In a busy suburban parish, a small group of students decided they wanted to make a difference. They weren't looking to build a massive community centre or solve all the problems in the world – they just wanted to help in some small way.

One day, they approached their parish priest and said, "Father, we want to do something meaningful, but we don't know if what we do will really matter. We feel like our efforts are tiny."

The priest smiled and said, "Even faith the size of a mustard seed can move mountains. Start small. Plant a seed, and see what grows."

Inspired, the students began "The Mustard Seed Project." Each week, they committed to small acts of kindness around their school and parish: leaving notes of encouragement for classmates, helping clean the church after Mass, visiting elderly parishioners, sharing snacks with

friends who forgot lunch, or simply offering a listening ear to someone who was having a rough day.

At first, it seemed like nothing had changed. But slowly, the energy began to shift. Other students noticed and joined in. Families saw the joy in their children's eyes and started volunteering. Teachers began integrating the small acts of kindness into classroom routines. Over time, these little seeds of faith and love grew into something extraordinary – a community alive with care, hope, and generosity.

The students realised what Jesus meant: it doesn't take huge gestures to make a difference. Small acts, rooted in faith and love, ripple outward in ways we cannot always see. One mustard seed can become a tree that shelters, nourishes, and inspires.

By the end of the year, the parish and school had a new culture – one of generosity, compassion, and hope. The students learned a powerful lesson: faith, even tiny, is never wasted.

**Simple message:** Start small, act with love, and trust God to multiply your efforts. Every kind word, every small act, every prayer is a seed that can grow into something amazing.
