

GUIDELINES ABOUT RECEIVING BOTH HOST AND CHALICE

1. There is one person distributing the Host and two with the Chalice.
2. Come to Communion as usual in two lines to receive the host.
3. Then turn left or right to receive from the Chalice if you so choose.
There is no dipping of the host into the Chalice.
4. Communion in your seat. The host will be brought to you at the end of Communion.



Please be patient and let Fr Vinh know your recommendations for improvement.

GUIDELINES RE COLLECTIONS - Please read carefully

1. Before Mass, when allocating people to do the collections, **choose one person who will take up the money immediately behind those bringing up the bread and wine**. *In this way the gift of our money is acknowledged as part of our offering to God.*
2. When the announcement is made for collections:
 - a) First Collectors go to the front and proceed.
 - b) Second Collectors start when the first collectors are three rows in. When finished if you are not the person taking up the money, please go quickly to your seats.

GOSPEL

Matthew 5:17-27

Jesus said to his disciples, 'Do not imagine that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets. I have come not to abolish but to complete them. I tell you solemnly, till heaven and earth disappear, not one dot, one little stroke, shall disappear from the Law until its purpose is achieved.'

Therefore, the man who infringes even one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be considered the least in the kingdom of heaven; but the man who keeps them and teaches them will be considered great in the kingdom of heaven.

'For I tell you, if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven.'

'You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not kill; and if anyone does kill he must answer for it before the court. But I say this to you: anyone who is angry with his brother will answer for it before the court; if a man calls his brother "Fool" he will answer for it before the Sanhedrin; and if a man calls him "Renegade" he will answer for it in hell fire. So then, if you are bringing your offering to the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your offering there before the altar, go and be reconciled with your brother first, and then come back and present your offering. Come to terms with your opponent in good time while you are still on the way to the court with him, or he may hand you over to the judge and the judge to the officer, and you will be thrown into prison. I tell you solemnly, you will not get out till you have paid the last penny.'

'You have learnt how it was said: You must not commit adultery. But I say to you: if a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye should cause you to sin, tear it out and throw it away; for it will do you less harm to lose one part of you than to have your whole body thrown into hell. And if your right hand should cause you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; for it will do you less harm to lose one part of you than to

have your whole body go to hell.'

'It has also been said: *Anyone who divorces his wife must give her a writ of dismissal*. But I say this to you: everyone who divorces his wife, except for the case of fornication, makes her an adulteress; and anyone who marries a divorced woman commits adultery.'

'Again, you have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: *You must not break your oath, but must fulfil your oaths to the Lord*. But I say this to you: do not swear at all, either by heaven, since that is God's throne; or by the earth, since that is his foot-stool; or by Jerusalem, since that is the city of the great king. Do not swear by your own head either, since you cannot turn a single hair white or black. All you need say is "Yes" if you mean yes, "No" if you mean no; anything more than this comes from the evil one.'

KIDS' CORNER

"You shall not kill" is the Fifth Commandment and one that most people think is pretty easy to keep. But Jesus challenges us to think a little deeper. If we are unkind to others, doesn't that kill the goodness they need from us? If we use angry words with another person, aren't we helping to kill their spirit of joy? God asks us to consider how we treat others and to work to be at peace with them. Can you think of any ways you might have hurt anyone lately? What can you do to make things better?
