FIRST READING

Exodus 17:8-13

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

Psalm 120:1-8

*Our help is from the Lord,
who made heaven and earth.*

1. I lift my eyes to the mountains; from where shall come my help? My help shall come from the Lord who made heaven and earth. <R>
2. May he never allow you to stumble! Let him sleep not, your guard. No, he sleeps not nor slumbers, Israel's guard. <R>
3. The Lord is your guard and your shade; at your right side he

stands. By day the sun shall not smite you nor the moon in the night. <R>

4. The Lord will guard you from evil, he will guard your soul. The Lord will guard your going and coming both now and for ever. <R>

SECOND READING

2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures – from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

The Holy Rosary -Sorrowful Mysteries-

The Five Sorrowful Mysteries are traditionally prayed on Tuesdays, Fridays, and, during the season of Lent, on Sundays:

1. The Agony in the Garden
2. The Scourging at the Pillar
3. The Crowning with Thorns
4. The Carrying of the Cross
5. The Crucifixion and Death

We see Jesus at his most difficult moment in the Agony in the Garden. He shrinks from facing the suffering he knows is to come: "Let this chalice pass". We pray for ourselves and for those we know and love who are facing suffering in their lives – loss, illness, chronic pain, ongoing depression. We pray for our world especially where war destroys peace.

BLESSING OF THE BETO SPORTS FACILITY IN COMORO, TIMOR-LESTE

Below are some points made by Mark in his talk to the Comoro parishioners on that occasion.

"The Beto Sports Facility came about through the link between two parishes, one in Australia and one in Timor. Each is of one Catholic faith and, I would suggest, one family. I dream of our shared faith as a strong roof. It shields us from the elements and it shields us from assailants. In my dream, it is an arching roof of steel, that extends from Australia to Timor. The roof brings about togetherness because everyone shelters beneath it. Our Faith is this roof, sheltering two nations who share and co-operate with one another. In Australia we have a saying "every thing under one roof."

The completion of the Beto Sports Facility is the story of two people who reached out across the water to shake hands in friendship. In fact it is symbolic of two free, independent and democratic nations working together. Someone once said to me that this is a good thing, even if it is only a very small project. Everything is a matter of perspective. To Beto, is this just a small project? No. To my parish, is this just a small project? No. Beto is rightfully proud of this accomplishment. What is important, is that each community work to their capacity, to the great glory of God the Father. In summary I would suggest that there is a deep sense of family in Beto. The family of Beto Community may not be rich in money but they are very rich in Spirit." **Mark Leaney**



GOSPEL

Luke 18:1-8

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death.'"

And the Lord said 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

THE STUDENT WHO NEVER GAVE UP

Emma was a 12-year-old in a Catholic school who loved art but struggled with math. Every day she tried, and every day she felt frustrated when her answers weren't quite right. She thought about giving up, feeling that maybe she just wasn't "good at math."

One afternoon, Emma's teacher noticed her frustration and said, "Emma, it's okay to ask for help again and again. Keep trying, and don't give up." Those words reminded Emma of a story she had heard in religion class, the persistent widow. Just like the widow kept returning to the judge, Emma realised she could keep asking, keep practicing, and keep trusting that effort and prayer would make a difference.

So she did. Each day, she worked through her homework, asked questions, and prayed for patience and

understanding. Slowly, her confidence grew. She even started helping a classmate who was struggling. Emma's persistence paid off, not only in better grades but in a renewed sense of hope and courage.

Emma's story is a modern reminder for schools, families, and parishes: faith, effort, and prayer go hand in hand. Life can be challenging, and answers don't always come immediately. But when we keep returning, keep asking, and keep trusting, God works in ways we often do not expect.

Just like Emma and the persistent widow, we are called to persevere in prayer and trust. Whether it's in school, at home, or in parish life, never give up on asking, hoping, and believing. God hears every prayer, and our persistence strengthens not only our faith but the community around us.

Go from here as those who will not give up or give in:

- Constant, when the world is changing.
- Listened to, when the clamour is loudest.
- Prepared, when others are uncertain.
- Unafraid, when fear reigns.
- Steady, when many are wavering.
- Compassionate, when others are serving themselves.
- Faithful, in times when faith counts for little.
