FIRST READING

1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9, 12-13, 22-23 Saul set off and went down to the wilderness of Ziph, accompanied by three thousand men chosen from Israel to search for David in the wilderness of Ziph.

So in the dark David and Abishai made their way towards the force, where they found Saul asleep inside the camp, his spear stuck in the ground beside his head, with Abner and the troops lying round him.

Then Abishai said to David, 'Today God has put your enemy in your power; so now let me pin him to the ground with his own spear. Just one stroke! I will not need to strike him twice.' David answered Abishai, 'Do not kill him, for who can lift his hand against the Lord's anointed and be without guilt? David took the spear and the pitcher of water from beside Saul's head, and they made off, No one saw, no one knew, no one work up; they were all asleep, for a deep sleep from the Lord had fallen on them.

David crossed to the other side and halted on the top of the mountain a long way off; there was a wide space between them. David then called out, 'Here is the king's spear. Let one of the soldiers come across and take it. The Lord repays everyone for his uprightness and loyalty. Today the Lord put you in my power, but I would not raise my hand against the Lord's anointed.'

With Christ, there is no need to worry about being misunderstood or to be extra careful with your words.


There is nothing to fearyou are totally accepted, totally and unconditionally loved.

Alex was enthusiastically Timor Leste welcomed to our parish at each of our weekend Masses. He was warmly thankful to God and

to us for our efforts to help our Comoro brothers and sisters. Alex shared a little of his story with us. He was involved in the resistance to the Indonesian annexation of Timor-Leste in 1975.

He suffered deafness because of imprisonment and ill-treatment. Independence formally occurred on 20th May 2002. Alex now has worked for the Anti-Corruption Commission in his government for 15 years. Alex will be with us for a further weekend. Take the opportunity to talk to him.

ZERO DISCRIMINATION DAY 1st March

March this year is the tenth anniversary of Zero Discrimination Day. Upholding everyone's rights is the responsibility of us all. Everyone can play a part in ending discrimination. During His brief time on earth, Jesus was good at drawing marginalized people to Himself—those who were consistently and deliberately pushed aside by society. He listened, He took action, and He met needs. He called on us to do likewise.

For example: Jesus welcomed children.

Even when Jesus's disciples saw children as a nuisance to be avoided, Jesus saw them as a treasure to be welcomed, to be received, to be loved, to be *cherished*."

2. Jesus valued women.

In first-century Palestine, it was unusual for men outside the family to address a woman in any way. But Jesus sat with a woman at the well, he healed the woman with the bleeding disorder

3. Jesus touched lepers.

Lepers were among the most stigmatized people in Jesus's day. But when a leper approaches Jesus to ask for healing, Jesus reaches out and touches him.

4. Jesus accepted Samaritans.

When the lawyer asks, "Who is my neighbour?" Jesus answers with the story of the Good Samaritan who had compassion for the Jewish man left to die at the side of the road.

How do we treat marginalised people?

Loving marginalized people is not an optional upgrade for the Church—it's the way we look like Jesus.

SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 15:45-49

The first man, Adam, as scripture says, became a living soul; but the last Adam has become a life-giving spirit. That is, first the one with the soul, not the spirit, and after that, the one with the spirit. The first man, being from the earth, is earthly by nature; the second man is from heaven.

As this earthly man was, so are we on earth; and as the heavenly man is, so are we in heaven. And we, who have been modelled on the earthly man, will be modelled on the heavenly man.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

In 13:34

Alleluia, alleluia! *I give you a new commandment:* love one another as I have loved vou. Alleluia!

GOSPEL

Luke 6:27-38

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I say this to you who are listening: Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who treat you badly. To the man who slaps you on one cheek, present the other cheek too; to the man who takes your cloak from you, do not refuse your tunic. Give to everyone who asks you, and do not ask for your property back from the man who robs you. Treat others as you would like them to treat you. If you love those who love you, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners love those who love them. And if you do good to those who do good to you, what thanks can you expect? For even sinners do that much. And if you lend to those from whom you hope to receive, what thanks can you expect? Even sinners lend to sinners to get back the same amount. Instead love your enemies and do good, and lend without any hope of return. You will have a great reward, and you will be sons of the Most High, for he himself is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked.

Be compassionate as your Father is compassionate. Do not judge, and you will not be judged yourselves; do not condemn, and you will not be condemned yourselves; grant pardon, and you will be pardoned. Give, and there will be gifts for you: a full measure, pressed down, shaken together, and running over, will be poured into your lap; because the amount you measure out is the amount you will be given back.'

EXPLORING THE WORD

In last week's gospel, the disciples learned that to be a faithful follower of Jesus, they must be committed to a new order. This week's text tells them how they must live in that new order; in a sense it provides the practical details. What Jesus is suggesting should not be confused with passivity or simply inaction or resignation in the face of persecution and injustice. Ouite the contrary! What Jesus is suggesting is radical action. It demands that we act towards others without being asked, that believers offer friendship and pardon constantly, without asking or hoping for anything in return.
